Covid 19 Update

The decision to move to Orange has been made on public health advice and reflects that we have moved past the peak of cases and our health system is able to cope. Within school, we are seeing that case numbers continue to decline due to high levels of vaccination and natural immunity after infection.

At Orange, face masks are no longer mandatory at school. However public health advice is that masks continue to be strongly encouraged when indoors and we will continue to promote this at Rangitoto College. Wearing a mask is a key health measure that slows the spread of COVID-19 in indoor settings. For that reason, we ask that visitors to the school, including parents and whānau, wear a mask whenever they are indoors on school grounds.

We also ask that your child continues to bring a mask to school every day. We will be strongly encouraging students to wear masks and ask parents to support this in your conversations with your child. There will be times when students have to wear a mask unless they have an exemption, assemblies will be an example of this. If there is a significant rise in cases at school or in the community, we will request that masks are worn in classrooms. We will return to our protocols of expecting all students to place their cellphones in a holder upon entry into each class. This ensures students do not get distracted during each class, promoting better learning outcomes.

At Orange, students are still required to wear a face mask on school or public transport.

We will continue to keep all the other health measures in place at school that we know slow the spread of COVID-19. These include ensuring our indoor spaces are well-ventilated, maintaining good hand hygiene and cough and sneeze etiquette, appropriate physical distancing whenever we can and, most importantly, staying home if we are sick. As we move into the winter months, we would ask parents to ensure any student who is unwell with a cough or cold remains at home until fully recovered. Please also ensure your child comes to school with adequate warm clothing given our classrooms will remain with windows and doors open for ventilation purposes.

Please continue to notify the school of all positive Covid-19 cases, as well as those who are self-isolating due to being Household Contacts. Please refer to the flowchart link and complete the Google Form for all positive cases.
