NCEA Literacy and Numeracy Assessment - Year 10 (and selected Year 11 to 13 students)

A reminder to parents of students in Year 10 that a number of Year 10 students will be sitting the new NCEA Literacy and Numeracy online testing this term.. The testing will take place across two days, Thursday 2nd and Friday 3rd November. These assessments are corequisites to students gaining the NCEA qualification and the Year 11 Diploma in 2024. Students will need a fully charged laptop and charger (not a tablet or ipad) for each day as well as their <u>NZQA Login details</u> (which they have already received earlier this year). The expected completion time for each assessment, as recommended by NZQA, is one hour. Students will return to normal timetabled classes as they finish.

 Year 10 students can test the readiness of their device for online testing by going to: <u>check</u> my device.

- Students can prepare themselves for what online testing looks like by visiting: <u>digital exam</u> <u>preparation for students</u>.
- Students should bring a calculator for the numeracy test (they will not be able to use the calculator on their laptop).

NCEA Final Exams

NCEA and Scholarship exams begin on November the 6th. Every student will be issued an exam slip in week 4 just prior to exams beginning. Students must bring this exam slip to every exam for identification and attendance purposes. All normal school expectations apply, such as wearing the correct uniform.

NCEA Exam expectations:

- 1. Be at your exam venue at least 30 minutes before the start of your exam.
- 2. Follow the instructions of the exam supervisor at all times.
- 3. Ensure you have all equipment required for your exam e.g. calculator. Equipment cannot be shared between students.
- 4. Cellphones and smartwatches must be in your bag and turned off or on silent during the examination.
- You may not leave the exam room for any reason, this includes toilet breaks, during the first
 45 minutes or the last 15 minutes of the exam.
- 6. You cannot talk to, disturb, or communicate in any way with other students.
- 7. Bring your exam admission slip to each exam and place it face up on your desk.
- 8. For exams in the auditorium, you must sit in your designated row.

Attendance in classes right up until the exams begin is vital, as the material being covered in classes will be closely aligned to that of the examination content.
