Principal Update

Our Year 9 students and their peer support leaders and tutors joined together for a day of team building, leadership growth and fun at our Kotahitanga Day last week. We continue to be pleased with the transition of the year 9 cohort and have recently explained the <u>Summit Diploma</u> to them, with students signing up in record numbers for some of the service opportunities available. Our 11 leadership teams have now been formed. Student Leaders interviewed all 456 candidates and have formed leadership teams that now encompass 250 students across years 10-13. They are hard at work creating opportunities to improve student engagement and experience. Further extracurricular involvement has been on offer for the sports teams playing in Summer Tournament week at various locations around the North Island, my thanks to all the coaches, managers and parent support that make these great experiences possible for our sportsmen and women.

Teacher Only Day (TOD) - Change of Date

Sport update

Waana Araroa joins Rangitoto College Netball this year with a wealth of knowledge and experience as a secondary school Premier Coach. Previously Premier Coach and Director of Netball at Epsom Girls Grammar School from 2013 to 2021, she was responsible for delivering strong and enjoyable performance and participation in netball pathways for over 30 teams. In partnership with staff, students and whānau the school achieved their inaugural UNISS, Combined Points championships and their inaugural 4 New Zealand Secondary Schools representatives. Winning the Auckland Secondary Schools Championship, Auckland Netball Secondary Schools Overall Points Award 6 consecutive NZSS Nationals campaigns and a top 4 National placing for four years were also highlights of that time.

Away from school netball Waana has coached at a regional performance level and was assistant coach of the Marvels National Netball League team which won its inaugural championship in 2021. She continues to be involved in coaching opportunities at this level. We are excited to welcome Waana to the coaching team here at Rangitoto.

We are delighted to welcome Tseard Theo van der Mei in a new role as Strength and Conditioning Coach. Sport has always been an integral part of Theo's life, which primarily came in the form of rugby. He played for teams including the Blues Age Groups, Northland Men's Sevens, and currently North Harbour Development.

While completing his Bachelor's degree, Theo worked as an Athletic Performance Intern for the Moana Pasifika Super Rugby team. Theo is currently studying a Master of Sport, Exercise, and Health at Auckland University of Technology and conducting research with Basketball New Zealand which will support his post-graduate degree.

NCEA Literacy and Numeracy Testing 2024

The Na family has had an exceptional few weeks. Junsu, a cellist from Year 11, has been offered a place in the Heifetz Institute 2024 Summer program. This is a three-week course to be held in June/July. It is a world-renowned programme that attracts top talent from all over the world. It is held at the Mary Baldwin University in Virginia and students are taught by top American musicians. Junsu is the top cellist in our school and contributes to the Symphony Orchestra and Chamber Orchestra as the lead cello, and is also in the elite Chamber Music programme. Older brother, Yeonsu in Year 13, has also gained international recognition, competing at the 13th Asian Canoe Slalom Championships in Pattaya, Thailand. Jeonsu won an outstanding bronze medal in the Junior Kayak Men's event.

It also aims to cover how to deal with disappointment and failure, rectify poor sleep habits and the benefits of positive psychology.

Many thanks go to the PTA for giving funds to the Learning Centre which has allowed them to purchase some reader pens to support our students with dyslexia. These devices can scan any printed text and turn it into speech which the student can listen to through headphones. This will be beneficial, especially for senior students studying subjects with lots of written sources such as History or Classics. These devices can be signed out by identified students from the Learning Centre. Students can come to the Learning Centre if they would like more information about how these pens can help them with their learning.
