University overview visits provide the opportunity for you to find out more about individual universities, their location, their study options, and the learning environments. They are an important source of information and a great research opportunity. The more research and information you have, the more informed your decisions.

You should be selective in choosing which presentations to attend, and only attend sessions for the institutions which you consider as a genuine potential future pathway for you. Advance research will help you to determine this. For each presentation you wish to attend, you:

1. must check with your period 4 teacher – your teachers have the right to decline your request to attend. Assessments take priority.
2. must catch up on work missed in Period 4
3. **be on time** - the sessions start at the beginning of Period 4, i.e. **12.55pm**. Late comers will be turned away!
4. **must sign up** via [this page on RangINET Careers](#). An attendance roll will be taken.
