1. Inter-School Math Olympiad

2. Otago Junior Math Competition (JMC) and Australian Math Competition (AMC)

If you want to be considered for math extension / acceleration classes for next year, you are highly recommended to participate in both (year 9 to year 11 students). You don't need to fill in any form. Just pay for the competitions – Year 9 to 11 students need to pay \$15, and Year 12 & 13 students need to pay \$10. The closing date for payment is March 21st.

There are three payment options:

- Parent Portal – sign into the Parent Portal on www.rangitoto.school.nz, using your Username and Password. Go to Online Fee Payment, Click Pay Student Fee, click 'Other Payments' select Maths Competition Juniors (Year 9 to 11) \$15 or Maths Competition Seniors (Year 12 and 13) \$10.

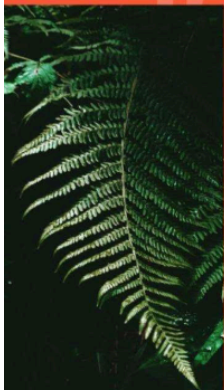
What do you need: Gloves
