A typical day

At the start of the programme, students will be given detailed information on what they will be doing each day, so they know what to expect and what to bring with them. Classwork is usually very practical, and activities are planned and designed with the kiwi culture in mind. Day trips give the students the opportunity to experience some of Auckland's best attractions and natural environment.



Programme Details

When is it offered?

The Term 4 programme takes place in November. It lasts 4 weeks and allows students to return home on completion of this programme.
100% attendance is expected, same as if students were attending normal classes.

Who can join?

Participation is limited to international students in senior year levels (Years 11, 12 or 13) who are studying at Rangitoto College for a period of six months to one year, and do not need to do NCEA examinations.

What type of activities do students participate in?

In-school classwork: A range of practical projects in the fields of Science, English, Food Technology, Physical Education, Performing Arts, and New Zealand Studies.

Students may work on a variety of learning approaches such as arts and crafts, design, carving, science experiments, cooking, artistic performances, cultural events, sporting activities, etc.

Day trips: Students visit landmarks and other popular attractions in Auckland. Activities and locations vary every year. Some popular excursions are indoor rock climbing, amusement parks, beach days, water parks, sports day, visiting a sheep farm, indoor skiing, tree climbing, bush hikes, Auckland city sightseeing, exploring the North Shore, mini golf, museums, and a tour of a sugar factory.

What do students have to wear?

Wearing the school uniform is not required, students can wear their normal clothes. For some activities, student may be asked to wear specific clothing and shoes for safety.
They will be notified in advance if required for the activity.

How much does it cost?
