Year 9 Option Subjects for Terms 3 and 4

Year 9 students will begin their second rotation of option subjects in Term 3, which, for most students, means two of their current subjects will change. Students can check their subjects on the student portal to see what options they are taking in Term 3, and should ensure they have stationery ready for the first day of Term 3. Please note that Digitech is a compulsory half-year course which many students have already completed, and others will complete in Terms 3 and 4. Some students will also be placed in English for Literacy (ENL) for additional support in English and with literacy skills. Parents and caregivers have been notified if their child has been placed in this course, and these changes will go live on the student portal by the end of the holidays.



In Terms 3 and 4, we are also excited to offer Te Ao Haka, a kapa haka course, and Whakairo, Māori carving, as option subjects. These subjects are an exciting opportunity for students to learn about Māori culture in a supportive environment, and no prior knowledge or skills are required. Students should speak to or email their dean if they would like to change their option subjects to pick up Te Ao Haka or Whakairo.
