This session will be run in collaboration with an Auckland Council specialist and our Kaumātua, providing a valuable learning opportunity focused on restoration and the significance of the site.

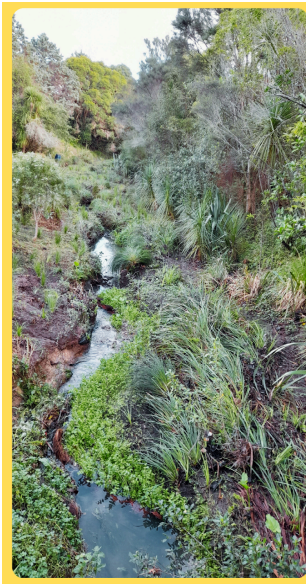
