This session will be run in collaboration with an Auckland Council specialist and our Kaumātua, providing a valuable learning opportunity focused on restoration and the significance of the site.

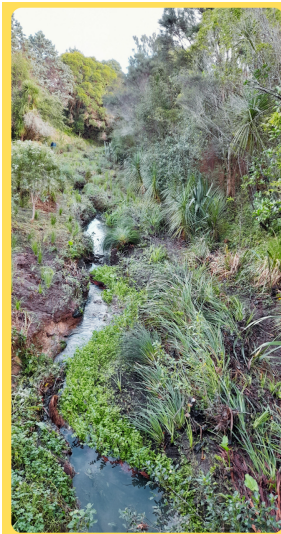

Innovative Young Mind's goal is to educate young women in Years 11 and 12 about the wide range of research and career opportunities available in **STEMM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and high-tech manufacturing)**.

IYM is offering young women the opportunity to take part in their Online 2026 programme. The programme will be delivered entirely online over four half-day sessions during the April school holidays.

Participants will be exposed to:

- inspiring interactive career panels
- research and innovation showcases
- virtual tours of labs and tech workspaces
- hands-on digital technology sessions
- team-building and networking sessions.

Participants can also meet women working in science and technology and make friends with like-minded young women. Places on IYM Online 2026 are limited to 100 and there is a **small participation fee of \$30**. There is also funding available to cover the \$30 fee for any students facing financial hardship.

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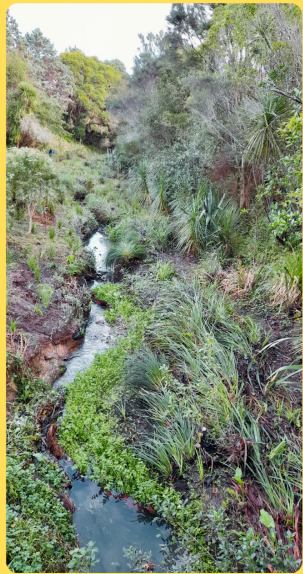
