#### **Principal Update**

As the winter sports season draws to a close, I would like to extend my gratitude to our coaches, managers, match officials, and sideline supporters for their assistance throughout the season. Congratulations to all students who played a sport this season! Your hard work and dedication have been amazing to watch. A special well done to those who have recently achieved great results. We wish all teams competing in Tournament Week the best of luck as they compete in locations across New Zealand next week.

There has been an ongoing debate about educational reforms in New Zealand. At Rangitoto, we are excited by the proposals and see a move towards a knowledge-based curriculum as a significant step in the right direction. Leading educational academic, Professor Carl Hendrick, made this pertinent comment recently about his own children's education:

"Thinking well requires having something to think with. Without background knowledge, there's no basis for inference, no filter for nonsense, no framework for judgment. A mind rich in knowledge isn't weighed down; it's agile. It can evaluate claims, imagine alternatives, and anticipate consequences. That is what I want for my daughters: not just to store facts, but to weave them into an internal framework that guides judgment when the world gets noisy for them."

With a new curriculum that esteems a knowledge-rich approach, there has also been a set of proposals designed to reform NCEA, aiming to improve our secondary assessment system. I encourage you to complete a submission on the proposed NCEA reforms here.

We're thrilled to announce that Chloe Turner has returned from the USA as the Under-17 World Champion in sailing! After six intense days of racing, she secured the gold medal with an impressive 14-point lead over her nearest competitor.

As the season draws to a close, we would also like to celebrate the recent successes of several of our premier teams. Our Netball team demonstrated incredible determination, fighting until the final minute of their North Harbour championship match to finish as runners-up. The First XV Boys Rugby team also had a successful season, reaching the semi-finals of the 1A competition, while the Premier Girls Rugby team had a strong showing, finishing in the top four of the North Harbour competition.

Both our Premier Girls Basketball and Premier Girls Hockey teams showcased outstanding performance by finishing in the top four of the Auckland Premier competition. Additionally, the Boys Basketball team finished second in the A1 competition, and the Boys Hockey team won their A1 final. Both teams have earned the opportunity to compete for a spot in their respective premier grades next year. We are incredibly proud of the hard work and dedication shown by all our student-athletes and their coaches.
