
#### **Winter Tournament Week**

Our talented Girls Football team demonstrated grit and determination throughout their tournament, culminating in a fantastic victory and winning the Trevor Osten Memorial Trophy. This was also echoed by our Girls Hockey team who were runners up in the Marie Fry Trophy. Whilst our Basketball Girls team delivered a strong performance, finishing 5th in the Northern Zone and successfully qualifying for Nationals.



#### **Much Ado About Performing Arts**

Congratulations to all the singers who represented Rangitoto College with pride in Rotorua and Dunedin at the recent Big Sing competitions. The Fundamentals brought home Silver from the Upper North Island Cadenza, and Serenata brought home Silver from the National Finale. Rangitoto Shakespeare Company presented two excellent performances of Much Ado About Nothing to very appreciative audiences, and our co-curricular Dance troupes came away with a slew of awards the DanceNZMade Regional Teams and Solo/Duo competitions - with many qualifying for the Nationals in a few weeks.

#### The Importance of Attendance

The government's target is for 80% of students to attend school regularly, that is to attend school more than 90% of the time. The most recently publicised Term 2, 2024 national attendance figures below gives an indication of the concern facing non-attendance in NZ schools.



At Rangitoto College we continue to place a high priority on our students attending school every day they are well enough to, and we continue to resource support in areas to improve student attendance. We do ask parents to be vigilant on their own child's attendance by monitoring the parent portal and communicating with their child's dean if you see any non-attendance you are not aware of.

It is important to consider the long-term effect of absences. Missing one day of school each week adds up quickly, this can be 40 days of the school year, and over a student's 13 years of schooling, that's the equivalent to missing over an entire year of school. The absence creates gaps in a student's education. Given the cumulative nature of learning, missing one lesson means your child may struggle to keep up with the knowledge being taught. This not only affects academic progress and achievement but can also have social and emotional developmental impacts.

Following the huge success of our **2025 Classics Tour**, Rangitoto College is excited to announce our second overseas **Classics Tour to Greece and Italy in the April holidays of 2027**. This unforgettable learning experience will immerse students in the heart of the ancient world.

Highlights of the tour include exploring the Colosseum, Roman Forum and Vatican City in Rome, a day trip to Florence, pizza-making in Sorrento, guided tours of Pompeii and Capri, and discovering the wonders of Athens, Delphi, Epidaurus, and Mycenae. Students will also enjoy an island-hopping cruise to Hydra, Poros, and Aegina.

#### Who can apply?

Students must be taking Classical Studies in Year 12 and Year 13 to be eligible for the tour. Students taking Art History will be considered if there are spots available. This trip is targeted at our current Year 10 and Year 11 students.

We are thrilled to be offering this incredible opportunity again, and we look forward to another journey into the world of the ancients!




## Study Skills Workshop Year 9 & 10
