#### **Principal's Update**

With three year groups on exams currently, the school is well underway with plans for 2026. Our Year 9 next year cohort continues to exceed all Ministry predictions, with 726 students enrolled. We are working with our MOE property advisors to try and ensure we have additional classrooms brought onto the school ahead of the enabling works for the permanent 10 new roll-growth classrooms that we have been granted.

Please be reminded that students should ensure their Diploma profile data is up to date. Deans (out-of-school activities) and Teachers in Charge (in-school activities) are the first points of contact if approved activities are missing from Profiles. Your son/daughter can check this in their FACTS (Parent Portal / PC School) online data.

# **NCEA & Diploma Exams**

39,180 individual exam entries shared across 2,760 students are occurring at the college for students involved in the NCEA & Scholarship exams in November. When we add in the Year 11 Diploma examinations, totalling 4150 entries across 900 students, the college is certainly a busy place at the moment.

3747 of the NCEA exams are digital this year, with Level 2 English having the largest number of digital exam entries in the country. It's great to see students arriving early, being well prepared and staying to the end of their exam session in order to give their very best.

Many students receive additional support for their exams. This support is vital to ensure they have the best possible chance to be successful. We'd like to thank those staff and members of the community who give up time to provide the additional resourcing. NCEA and Scholarship exam results will be available mid-January and early February respectively, while students in the Year 11 Diploma should have results back by 19th November. Year 11s will be back in college across three days beginning 19th November, for exam review.

### **Academic and Online Integrity**

Recently, the college has observed increased instances where a small number of students have not met our expectations regarding integrity, primarily academic honesty and online conduct.

Assessments are an opportunity for students to measure their knowledge against specific standards. Taking any form of action to cheat during assessments is treated very seriously by the college. We expect students to complete all assessments based solely on the knowledge gained from their lessons.

The breach of academic integrity has also been evident across online communications and search engines. Sharing answers is also treated as a breach of assessment integrity, as is using online forums inappropriately through an assessment process. We have and will continue to take disciplinary action with students who are involved in these behaviours.

The long-term value of honesty and integrity far outweighs any short-term result. This message continues to be communicated to our students at the college and we would ask you to reiterate this at home.

#### **International Baccalaureate**

We are incredibly proud of our Year 13 lB students who are currently writing their final examinations. Their dedication, resilience, and hard work throughout this challenging programme has been truly inspiring, and we wish them every success as they complete their lB journey, await their results and start their tertiary studies at global universities. We have also been profoundly impressed by the progress of the Year 12 cohort this year. They have already demonstrated a strong commitment to academically challenging themselves while being actively involved in the wider life of the school through CAS. It has been gratifying to witness the engagement and growth across both year levels. We are thrilled to be a dual-pathway school and deeply value the International Baccalaureate as an essential, vibrant and growing part of the college.

#### **Parent Teacher Association (PTA)**
